New partnership between ISHA and the Turkish Society of Preventive Hip Surgery

The “Society of Preventive Hip Surgery” was founded in Ankara, Turkey, in 2012 to bring together the efforts to develop and disseminate scientific knowledge on hip joint preservation in its various affections and disorders. The Constitution states that the society’s primary goal is to advance the knowledge and treatment of hip disorders and improve the lives of patients with various hip disorders. In this specific focus of interest, the society is proud of its history as being the first organisation ever founded in the field of hip preservation.

Since its foundation, the society has been fully recognised as a partner society and has regularly cooperated with the TOTBİD (Turkish Society of Orthopaedics and Traumatology) in various scientific activities of symposiums, hip arthroscopy courses, cadaver courses on adult and paediatric hip, webinars and live surgeries. The society is an academic membership organisation that currently has 90 active members, comprising well-known orthopaedic surgeons, physical therapists and scientists whose practice and research orientation mainly focuses on hip preservation. Many are internationally recognised opinion leaders, mentors, researchers, and educators, but the society recruits young members at all career stages as a dynamic scientific force.

Today, with over 10 years of leading performance, Turkey’s Society of Preventive Hip Surgery has emerged as a significant educational organisation for the benefit of patients and its members.

Following the ISHA Glasgow meeting in 2022, we have countersigned an agreement of partnership to collaborate in scientific and educational activities by promoting each other’s meetings, contributing lectures and partnering in webinar activities.

Both parties share similar objectives with the desire to promote development, research, and best practice in arthroscopic and hip preservation surgery to the international professional community via continuing medical education programmes, the sharing of best practices, support of research and encouraging professional collaboration. The partnership aims to enable both parties through collaboration to advance research and to train and educate healthcare specialists with interest in hip preservation to improve patient outcomes, as well as enabling each party to continue to progress their individual objectives.

Both parties intend that this partnership will enable each party to extend their individual outreach, enhance both parties’ awareness and profile, and help build collaboration and exchange between the global hip preservation community.
